2014/15 has been another eventful year for the Plymouth and Cornwall Cancer Fund, and we have been pleased to welcome some new committee members who have brought another dimension to the charity. Our focus on fundraising during the year has provided us with a platform for highlighting the charity's work in supporting local people suffering from cancer, their families, and the staff and infrastructure that provides their care.

The increase in the number of fundraising events and the involvement of hospital staff and volunteers has been encouraging, and has raised much needed funds to support the charity in its work. Larger events such as the Sparkwell Horse and Dog Show, Plymouth Half Marathon, the River Dart Country Park Mud and Sweat Run and Walkhampton Saturday Market, as well as the smaller and more personal events are really appreciated and our thanks go to all those who have helped us achieve this. We also joined the web based 'Just Giving' organization this year to make donation easier and provide fundraisers with advice and help in their efforts.

Requests for Hardship Grants in 2014/15 were slightly less than in the previous year. 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP): Accounting and Reporting by Charities, published in March 2005 and applicable accounting standards.

a) Accounting bases

The trustees have taken advantage of the special exemptions contained within the Charities Act 2011 to prepare a receipts and payments account together with a statement of assets and liabilities at the year end.

b) Assets

Assets shown in the statement of assets and liabilities are stated at cost, net of grants received.

c) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected life , which in all cases is estimated at 4 years. Items of equipment are capitalised where the purchase price exceeds £250.

2 FUNDS ACCOUNTING

Funds held by the charity are as follows:

Unrestricted general funds: These are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Research Fund: These are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

HARDSHIP GRANTS

Immediate cash grants were paid to cancer patients or their families in a total of nearly £11,685 with amounts ranging from £15 to £350. Funds are constantly needed to enable us to continue to help people in real financial need. In some cases, patients are perhaps no longer in a position to work or the financial implications of undergoing treatment put a further burden on their circumstances. Assistance towards travel costs to attend for treatment, additional clothing, bed linen or telephone costs represent the type of assistance sought. These requests are made to the Fund through the Mustard Tree Support Centre at Derriford Hospital where full financial assessments are made prior to application.

Statement of the trustees' responsibilities

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES AND AFFAIRS

Treasurer's report for the financial year to 31 October 2015

Income, at nearly £62500, has again improved, marginally, which is most pleasing, and this is due primarily to the shop, over £50000 in a year for the first time, although investment income has increased slightly also.

Expenditure overall at £66000 went up at a greater rate than income, however, but this was due to the support given by the Fund in the form of grants. Costs relating to the running of the shop and administration both reduced.

The grants made in the financial year totalled nearly £35000, and this included hardship support of £11481, reduced by over £3000 on the previous year which had been exceptional. Over £23000 was made available in support of training for key posts in Oncology. Again no specific equipment has been purchased. So, a comfortable financial position was still in place at the end of the accounting period with monetary assets over £70000 and, pleasingly, investments were again valued at just under that figure, despite difficulties in the markets.

Ongoing financial commitments at the end of the year, all for training, are placed at nearly £70000 and the trustees are confident that this is achievable, primarily through income, especially as the Fund is increasingly benefitting from fund raising.
