1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP): Accounting and Reporting by Charities, published in March 2005 and applicable accounting standards.

a) Accounting bases

The trustees have taken advantage of the special exemptions contained within the Charities Act 2011 to prepare a receipts and payments account together with a statement of assets and liabilities at the year end.

b) Assets

Assets shown in the statement of assets and liabilities are stated at cost, net of grants received.

c) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected life , which in all cases is estimated at 4 years. Items of equipment are capitalised where the purchase price exceeds £250.

2 FUNDS ACCOUNTING

Funds held by the charity are as follows:

Unrestricted general funds: These are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Research Fund: These are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Chairman's Report 2013/14

2013/14 has been a promising year for the Plymouth and Cornwall Cancer Fund. Our Fundraising Strategy developed last year has provided us with a platform for raising our profile and promote its work in supporting local people suffering from cancer, their families, and the staff and infrastructure that provide their care.

The Fundraising Focus Group has continued to explore opportunities for fundraising, and along with the website has resulted in a marked improvement in income. A target of raising £10,000 was set, and this was largely achieved, with over £9,000 raised in a wide variety of events including the Sparkwell Horse and Dog Show, Plymouth Half Marathon and the Saturday Walkhampton Market Stall. Our thanks go to all our supporters who have helped us achieve this.

The total amount awarded in Hardship grants in 2013/14 increased from the previous year by just under 18%. These grants mainly took the form of assisting with the travel costs of the patients attending Derriford Hospital for treatment or to attend a specialist centre for diagnostics and/or treatment. I would like to acknowledge the work of the staff who identify these patients and families in need, and put forward requests on their behalf.

Our Shop in Hyde Park, Plymouth continues to flourish. The extra space acquired last year allowing us to display more donated items, has again rewarded us with an increase in weekly takings. The shop is still our main source of income, and integral in our mission to support local people affected by cancer and those that care for them. All this would not be possible without the sterling work done by our volunteers and the continued loyalty of local people.

We have continued to provide finance to support various members of staff working in cancer care wanting to attend conferences. Continued professional development is essential for staff working in this locality, to keep up to date and abreast of latest techniques and practices. With the pressure on NHS budgets, staff education and training is often targeted in cutbacks. Plymouth and Cornwall Cancer Fund are pleased that we are able to ease this burden and play a part in maintaining high standards of care.

The Plymouth and Cornwall Cancer Fund agreed funding to provide equipment or facilities, and the main funding commitment was our continued support in the employment of a chaplain in palliative care. We also agreed to fund a Specialist Nurse training post to ensure succession planning, and support two research projects by funding a Nursing and Doctoral Fellow posts.

Our thanks go to Derriford Hospital who organised a Charities Week last summer. This provided us with an opportunity to promote the work of the charity to staff and the general public.

Achieving our goals in the future is not going to be easy in the current economic climate and will require the continued support of our committee, fundraisers and volunteers. These dedicated people willingly give up their time and energy and I am grateful that they are up for the challenge ahead

HARDSHIP GRANTS

Immediate cash grants were paid to cancer patients or their families in a total of nearly £14,800 with amounts ranging from £10 to £400. Funds are constantly needed to enable us to continue to help people in real financial need. In some cases, patients are perhaps no longer in a position to work or the financial implications of undergoing treatment put a further burden on their circumstances. Assistance towards travel costs to attend for treatment, additional clothing, bed linen or telephone costs represent the type of assistance sought. These requests are made to the Fund through the Mustard Tree Support Centre at Derriford Hospital where full financial assessments are made prior to application.

Statement of the trustees' responsibilities

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare receipts and payments accounts and statement of assets and liabilities for each financial year which properly present the charity's receipts and payments for the year together with its assets and liabilities at the end of the period, and adequately distinguish any material special trust or other restricted fund of the charity. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:-

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES AND AFFAIRS

Treasurer's report for the financial year to 31 October 2014

Income in the financial year is up nearly £9000 – over 17% – on the previous year. This is primarily due to an increase in donations from events, up £6000, but also to the shop where, once again, takings improved, up by nearly £2000. There was also a welcome increase in the return on our investments.

Expenditure has risen slightly. For the shop we paid more rent following the acquisition of increased floor space in the previous year. General administrative costs also rose, primarily in relation to support given to the fund raising events.

As to grants, at £25870, these were only slightly up on the previous year. Support for hardship increased by some £2600 to nearly £14800 and we continued to support courses and training for Oncology staff besides continuing to partly fund the Palliative Care Chaplain. No specific equipment was purchased by us for the Oncology unit.

The result is that our funds at the end of the financial year had increased by £3000 to over £76000 and, additionally, we have investments of nearly £70000. A comfortable position.

However, at the start of new financial year, we have commitments totalling over $\pounds 61000$, this for equipment, training and support posts and the Chaplain. We, therefore, need to work increasingly hard to raise additional funds to cover this planned expenditure. If we do not do this then we will not have the financial ability, in the future, to support future financial requests.
