1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP): Accounting and Reporting by Charities, published in January 2015 and applicable accounting standards.

a) Accounting bases

The trustees have taken advantage of the special exemptions contained within the Charities Act 2011 to prepare a receipts and payments account together with a statement of assets and liabilities at the year end.

b) Assets

Assets shown in the statement of assets and liabilities are stated at cost, net of grants received.

c) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected life , which in all cases is estimated at 4 years. Items of equipment are capitalised where the purchase price exceeds $\pounds 250$.

2 FUNDS ACCOUNTING

Funds held by the charity are as follows:

Unrestricted general funds : These are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Research Fund: These are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Chairman's Report 2015/16

2015/16 has been an interesting year for the Plymouth and Cornwall Cancer Fund. Last year I reported that I felt that the time was right for the Trustees to debate the direction of the charity. PCCF is a small charity and discussion was needed as to whether it remained so, or steps should be taken to grow into a larger enterprise that could raise more funds and have a more significant impact on cancer care. The outcome of these discussions was that in April 2016 it was agreed that a costing exercise should be undertaken to review the benefits of employing a part time fundraiser for a twelve month period to ascertain the merits of such a post. In July it was agreed, and the post went to advert and an appointment made to commence in November 2016.

Our thanks go to all those involved in fundraising events and the involvement of more hospital staff has been encouraging. This has raised much needed funds to support the charity in its work. Larger events such as the Sparkwell Horse and Dog Show, Plymouth Half Marathon and Plymouth 10k as well as the smaller and more personal events are really appreciated and our thanks go to all those who have helped in this way. Just Giving continues to make donations easier and provide fundraisers with advice and help them in their efforts.

Requests for Hardship Grants in 2015/16 were slightly less than in the previous year. These grants mainly took the form of assisting with the travel costs of the patients attending Derriford Hospital for treatment or to attend a specialist centre for diagnostics and/or treatment. I would like to acknowledge the work of the staff who identify these patients and families in need and put forward requests on their behalf.

Currently our major source of income comes from our Shop in Hyde Park, Plymouth, which continues to flourish. This income stream allows us to continue supporting local people affected by cancer and those that care for them. All this would not be possible without the sterling work done by our volunteers and the continued loyalty of local people.

This year, we have continued to provide finance to support various members of staff working in cancer care wanting to attend conferences. We have also supported local nursing staff by funding part time nursing posts to undertake specialist training, and we have again agreed to continue supporting the Oncology & Palliative Care Chaplain working within Derriford Hospital. Plymouth and Cornwall Cancer Fund are pleased that we are able to ease this financial burden and play a part in maintaining high standards of care.

Last summer we were asked to support two new initiatives. Firstly, an initiative to develop a Remote Colorectal Patient Monitoring System and a second to improve hospital end of life care for those who sadly end their days in hospital. We gladly agreed funding to decorate and refurbish two side rooms on Brent Ward for this purpose and also to support the project to improve colorectal cancer care.

Again, achieving our goals in the coming year will prove a challenge and it will be interesting to see the impact of a dedicated Fundraiser. I am confident that all those, new and long standing supporters of this charity will rise to this challenge, and, as always, I am grateful to everyone, committee members, volunteers and fundraisers who gave up their time and energy in 2015/16 and have provided us with the platform to fulfil PCCF aims.

SUPPORT FOR HARDSHIP

One hundred and twelve immediate cash grants were paid to cancer patients in 2015/2016 or their families with amounts ranging from **£20** to **£350**.

Funds are constantly needed to enable us to continue to help people in real financial need. In some cases, patients are perhaps no longer in a position to work or the financial implications of undergoing treatment put a further burden on their circumstances.

Assistance towards travel costs to attend for treatment, additional clothing, bed linen or telephone costs represent the type of assistance sought.

These requests are made to the Charity through the Macmillan Mustard Tree Support Centre at Derriford Hospital where full financial assessments are made prior to application.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES AND AFFAIRS

<u>Treasurer's report for the financial year to</u> <u>31 October 2016.</u>

Income from all sources, shop, donations and investments was marginally down, at just under $\pounds 61000$, on the previous year but this was still a good performance in difficult financial times.

Expenditure in the twelve month period reduced by nearly £10000, primarily because of a reduction in grants paid, ie financial support requested, down from nearly £35000 to just over £24000. For the second year running hardship grants reduced and no equipment was purchased. Support and shop costs increased slightly.

The result is an improvement, overall, of over $\pounds4000$ in total liquid funds, at $\pounds76000$, at the end of the financial year. Additionally there was an increase in the value of our investments of some $\pounds3000$ during the financial year, these being valued at over $\pounds73000$.

Overall, we ended the financial year in a stronger financial position and well placed to continue our support for hardship and to meet funding commitments made for the next twelve months. Sufficient funds were held to maintain the reserves policy of our charity.
